Two walking routes are marked here from the Porters Lodge to the Centre.

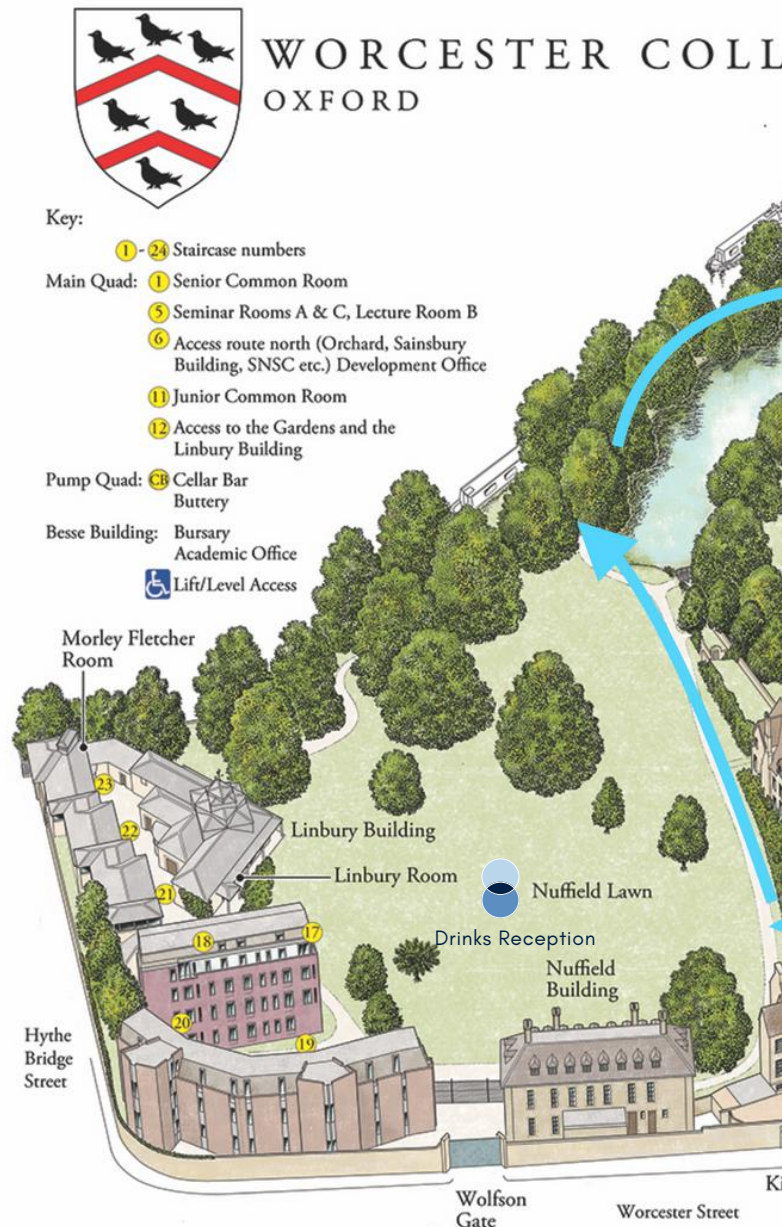

Route from Porters Lodge to Conference Venue

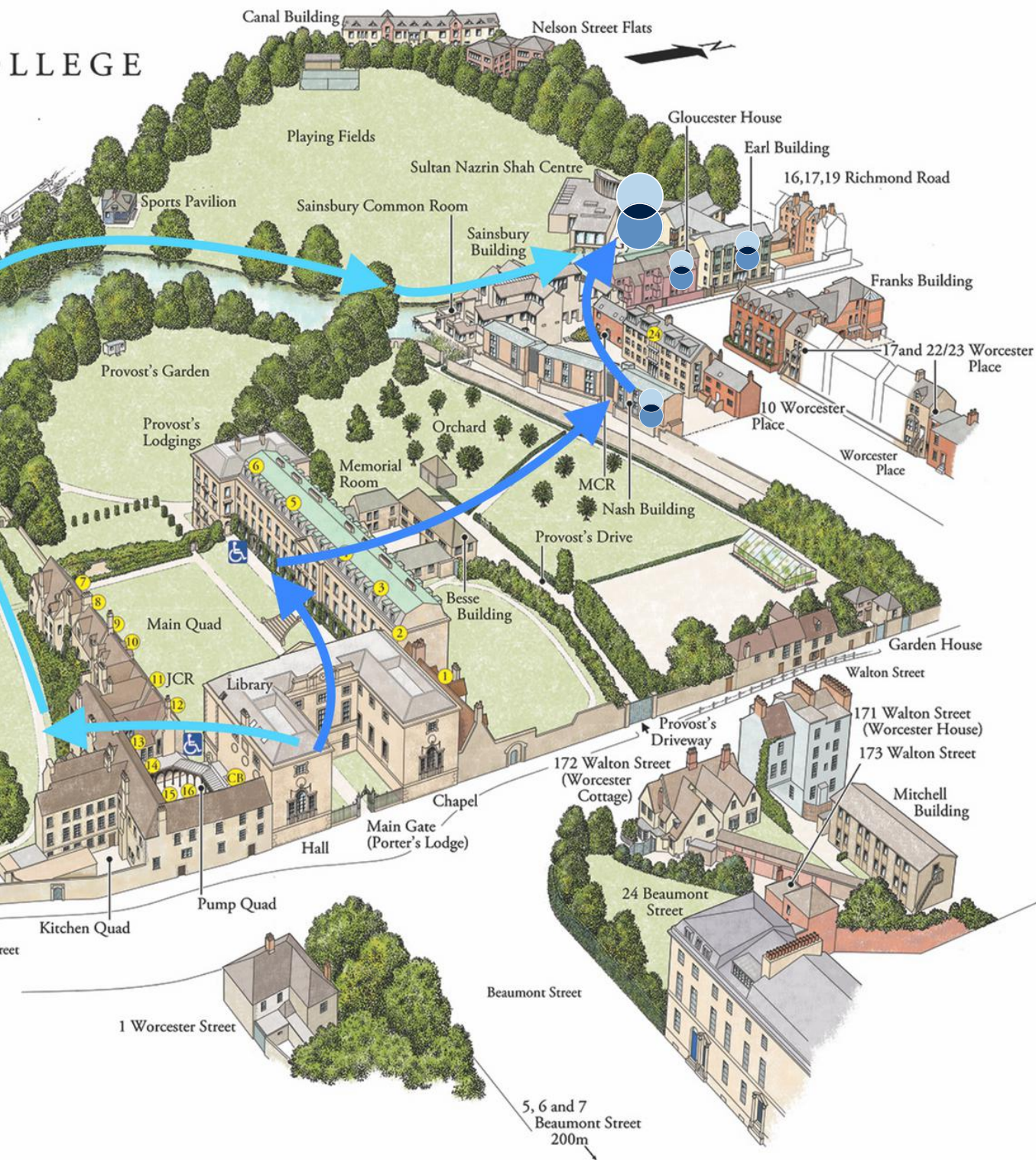
 Scenic Route
